LaLiga is a sports association made up of the clubs and public limited sports companies that compete in the professional ranks of Spanish football. LaLiga, based in Madrid, is responsible for the LaLiga Santander and LaLiga 11213 leagues and their television production.

Since 2010, the International Federation of Football History and Statistics has considered the top tier of the Spanish game to be the best league in the world, in view of the record-breaking honours held by the competition's affiliated clubs and players.

The institution seeks to be a leader in terms of quality and technological innovation right across the board, offering its clubs optimum service levels and providing supporters with the best possible product. LaLiga's desire is for the football-viewing experience to be a unique one which enables fans to enjoy coverage to the max.

The association also has an active foundation and is the world's only professional football league with a league for intellectually challenged footballers: LaLiga Genuine. Additionally, LaLiga lends its support to other sports and Spanish federations through the LaLiga4Sports project and promotes women's football with 16 teams in the Liga lberdrola.

LaLiga in numbers

- 20 teams in the First Division (LaLiga Santander).
- It is broadcast in 182 countries around the world. There are 90 international LaLiga broadcasters.
- More than 40 million followers on social media and a LaLiga YouTube channel with over 1.5 million subscribers.
- The last 4 Champions League winners hail from LaLiga.
- LaLiga is the best-represented league in European competitions, with 7 Spanish clubs involved in this season's Champions League and Europa League combined.



Vintage charm in abundance

The smallest stadium in the top flight also happens to be one of the most exhilarating venues in LaLiga. The Armeros stronghold is a throwback to the football of yesteryear, when players would routinely end matches covered in mud, and its small pitch means that the opposition box is always just a long ball away.



Ipurua is also proof that crowd size is not everything. Despite – or perhaps because of – its limited capacity, Eibar's ground is as loud and daunting as they come, as evidenced by the club's fantastic home record. This is a hotspot for football at its most authentic.
