LaLiga is a sports association made up of the clubs and public limited sports companies that compete in the professional ranks of Spanish football. LaLiga, based in Madrid, is responsible for the LaLiga Santander and LaLiga 11213 leagues and their television production.

Since 2010, the International Federation of Football History and Statistics has considered the top tier of the Spanish game to be the best league in the world, in view of the record-breaking honours held by the competition's affiliated clubs and players.

The institution seeks to be a leader in terms of quality and technological innovation right across the board, offering its clubs optimum service levels and providing supporters with the best possible product. LaLiga's desire is for the football-viewing experience to be a unique one which enables fans to enjoy coverage to the max.

The association also has an active foundation and is the world's only professional football league with a league for intellectually challenged footballers: LaLiga Genuine. Additionally, LaLiga lends its support to other sports and Spanish federations through the LaLiga4Sports project and promotes women's football with 16 teams in the Liga lberdrola.

LaLiga in numbers

- 20 teams in the First Division (LaLiga Santander).
- It is broadcast in 182 countries around the world. There are 90 international LaLiga broadcasters.
- More than 40 million followers on social media and a LaLiga YouTube channel with over 1.5 million subscribers.
- The last 4 Champions League winners hail from LaLiga.
- LaLiga is the best-represented league in European competitions, with 7 Spanish clubs involved in this season's Champions League and Europa League combined.

From minnows to big fish

One of the first Spanish cities to witness the beautiful game was the birthplace of a team that, after several iterations and name changes, would eventually become what it is today: one of LaLiga's classic clubs. Moreover, their supporters – like the people of Andalusia in general – are renowned for their passion and have had a fair amount to shout about in recent decades.

Following a period of turmoil, Málaga were refounded once again in 1994, whereupon they finally found the necessary stability to establish themselves as an elite club.

Since then, the club has enjoyed several impressive seasons and qualified for Europe on a few occasions, with the highlight coming in 2012, when they finished fourth and then embarked on a fairy-tale Champions League run.

The club's Estadio La Rosaleda has been home to a number of LaLiga greats. These include the deadly 'double D' – the attacking duo made up of Dely Valdés and Darío Silva – as well as Catanha, nicknamed the Seagull because of his peculiar celebrations and, more recently, the likes of Isco, Santi Cazorla and Ruud van Nistelrooy.

The stadium La Rosaleda

A hallowed, much-loved home

Over the course of a history spanning more than 75 years, La Rosaleda has staged league, domestic cup and Champions League action, not to mention nine games involving the Spanish national team and three group-stage fixtures at the 1982 World Cup. Arguably the most memorable match to take place there, however, was the legendary 5-1 thrashing of none other than Barcelona.



The Boquerones faithful are a loyal bunch, with thousands of fans turning out week in, week out to try to drive their team on. Indeed, despite the club being locked in a relegation battle this term, this atmospheric venue continues to rank in the top half of LaLiga Santander in terms of its average attendance.
